Overview

Do you want more than memorization and simplified interpretations?

If so, Kepler College is right for you. Our courses are designed for the serious student seeking essential astrological knowledge, tools and skills. They provide the beginner with a great foundation, the aspiring professional with solid skills to be able to earn a living at astrological consultation, and the professional astrologer with continuing education to further serve their clients.

We know you want value for your money. You want to exit a course knowing more, be able to use that knowledge and have the skill to evaluate the material you explore on your own. Our instructors allow you to develop the tools and skills you need to succeed. That is our commitment. Kepler College has provided our students with an in-depth astrological experience since 2000.

Quick Facts

Kepler College offers three learning opportunities: courses, webinars and workshops. Our courses are interactive; instructors provide feedback and evaluation. All courses count toward certificates and diplomas. Our workshops are interactive but do not require any demonstration of learning. Webinars are lectures and passive learning. All live sessions are recorded and available to you for 3 years.

Qualifying Courses (the Certificate and Diploma Program)

Kepler College encourages students to develop lasting astrological fellowships as they interact with classmates.

All courses provide an opportunity to delve intensively into a topic area and multiple opportunities to develop skill, confidence and professional competence.

Our classes are online and meet weekly. Our classroom contains articles, AV materials, and useful web connections. Students test their knowledge through quizzes, graded assignments, and online discussions.

Certificate courses are open to everyone.

- Credit courses are five or ten weeks in length. We also offer some self-paced courses that students can take at any time.
- Our courses provide an intensive, in-depth material exploration and regular instructor feedback.
- Courses include homework, and for credit, students should expect to spend between 8 and 12 hours per week working on course materials and attending live classes online.
- Each course has an online classroom with an outline of the weekly objectives and lecture notes. Additional resources include presentations, audio-visual resources, discussion forums, supplemental readings, quizzes, and more.

- In all courses, students receive feedback, and their work is evaluated. For credit, a student must complete the required material (passing grade of 70% to 75% or above on the assignments and participation in the discussions to obtain the credit for the course). Students will receive an email providing their final evaluation and acknowledging completion of their course. Certificates require the successful completion of 30 or 40 weeks of courses.
- Our courses provide an intensive, in-depth material exploration and regular instructor feedback
- Students who have taken or wish to take a course outside of Kepler College to apply to this certificate should contact the registrar at registar@keplercollege.org for details on what is required.
- Supplemental Materials: In some certificates, there are supplemental courses or a library of supplemental materials available only to enrolled students. Unless specifically designated by the instructor, this material is not required but may be explored as desired for the student's enjoyment and self-development.
- Language: Unless noted otherwise, all courses at Kepler College are taught in English. Proficiency in English is required for all students.¹
- Practicums, Introduction to Counselling and Consulting Skills classes require live attendance to be awarded academic credit.

Diploma courses.

• There are required courses for a Diploma. All required course numbers begin with an 'R'. Most of the required courses are included in the Certificates. As you complete Certificates, all the courses qualify toward Diploma credits. The additional credits can be any other elective in our catalog.

Quick Facts on Additional Learning Opportunities at Kepler College

Kepler College offers three different types of learning opportunities, each with a different focus. All Kepler College offerings, courses, webinars, workshops, recorded matetial, eBooks, and special events can be found in our store https://store.keplercolleg.org.

Complimentary Classes: The store offers free classes. These classes are provided for public enjoyment and development. They do not have live interaction or instructor assistance. All new students should take the free Placement Quiz to test their knowledge prior to registering for a course.

Community Webinars: Our free Community Webinars are 1-1/2 hours in length and provide an opportunity for astrologers to experience a variety of topics and speakers. These webinars are offered to the community as part of our non-profit mission and as a thank you

for supporting Kepler College. The recorded webinars can be found on our YouTube channel https://www.youtube.com/kepler%20college

Community Webinars allow invited speakers to present a topic they are excited about—perhaps one new or unusual. This opportunity is available to both seasoned professionals and those new to the community.

Scholarship Webinars: Kepler College periodically offers paid webinars to raise money for student scholarships. All proceeds from the webinars support our Maggie Nalbandian Scholarships, which are awarded every term.

Workshops: Workshops are a good way to explore a topic without the pressure of academic assignments or evaluation. These range from two to 20 hours in length. Topics vary from the history of astrology to astrological techniques. Workshops are in a lecture format with opportunities for audience questions. Workshops are held in our online classrooms, and the recordings are available to you for 3 years.

Students new to astrology generally begin with the Fundamentals Certificate courses (RN101, RN102, RN103 and RN104). These courses provide the students with the tools they need to analyze a natal chart and provide a clear interpretation.

Most students continue by expanding into the Predictive courses or the Counseling and Relationship courses. The Predictive courses allow students to better understand the rhythms of a lifetime through an analysis of transits, progressions, directions, and more. The Counseling and Relationship courses help the students develop their consultation skills.

At this point, students can expand their astrological studies in a direction that interests them or go on to complete the Kepler College Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA, see page 49).

Fundamentals Certificate

Beginning Academic Year 2024-2025 this certificate requires 40 weeks of study.

This certificate focuses on natal astrology. The certificate series provides a solid grounding in the symbolism of Western natal astrology. It covers how symbolism has evolved over time, how to synthesize and apply that knowledge to delineate a natal chart and an awareness of the ethical issues involved.

By the end of this certificate, students will have understood how different philosophies and techniques developed within the Western astrological tradition from Hellenistic to modern times. They will be aware of many astrological controversies and enjoy continual practice in chart interpretation

FUNDAMENTALS CERTIFICATE:

Completion of this certificate or its equivalent is required for the Diploma.

RN101 Fundamentals I: Introduction Introduction to Astrology

Instructors: Donna Young, Denise Menton, Sam Reynolds, Callum Wilkinson (TA)

Required for the Professional Diploma

Prerequisite: none

This course is designed to introduce students to the core components of the natal chart and how these individual pieces combine for interpretation. By the end of this course, students will have worked with essential techniques for chart interpretation and can identify the strengths and weaknesses of different approaches. Students can synthesize these core astrological components into a basic coherent and meaningful interpretation without relying on outside resources.

The student will have a solid understanding of the planets and how the signs and houses modify their meaning. They will learn to evaluate the planets highlighted in the chart based on their placement by sign and house, basic dignities, and interaction through aspects and dispositors. They will be able to synthesize this information into a basic, coherent and meaningful interpretation without relying on outside resources

Topics covered include:

Introduction to the astronomical underpinnings of the astrological chart

- Exploration of the interplay between astronomy and the astrological meanings of the planets, including when retrograde; comparing meanings from Hellenistic to modern; and an introduction to the mythology of the planets.
- Examination of how a planet's placement in a sign, including elements, modes of action, dispositors, major aspects, and basic dignities and debilities, modify its meaning.
- Introduction to astrological houses, how their meanings have changed over time, and how they enhance an interpretation.

RN102 Fundamentals II: Interpretation Essentials

Instructors: Enid Newberg, Lori Waters, Lindsay Michko (TA)

Required for the Professional Diploma

Prerequisite: RN101 or equivalent

This course moves the student beyond the basics to distinguishing how chart components are modified for each individual, including spotting major life themes. By the end, students will know the important areas of practice and controversy in the course topics and understand the basis of many specialized interpretive techniques. They will also be able to critically question and/or evaluate the rationale of authors and workshop or conference presenters on their methods for natal chart interpretation.

Students will

- Explore the historical roots and the philosophical purposes for natal chart interpretation.
- Compare house systems to help identify those more suited to regular use and others that are more situation-specific
- Identify lunation phases and their natal chart interpretation
- Examine the foundation of all aspects, including the minor aspects
- Explore major life themes through close aspect networks, aspect configurations and declination
- Personalize interpretation by using sensitive points such as the nodes, the vertex, part of fortune, part of spirit, solstice points, pre-natal eclipse, decans and dwads, and the Aries point.
- Explore how major asteroids, dwarf planets, and fixed stars can affect the interpretation.

By the end of RN102, students will know the important areas of practice and controversy in the course topics. They will be able to understand the basis of many specialized interpretive techniques. Most lessons are "must know" supplements to the basics; some lessons introduce less well-known topics to help students understand techniques and methodologies they may wish to pursue independently. The goal is for students to be able to think critically. Question and evaluate the rationale and methodology of astrological authors and presenters that students will encounter at conferences, workshops, or online.

RN103 Fundamentals III: Beyond the Basics

Instructors: Jenn Zahrt, Carol Tebbs

Required for the Professional Diploma

Prerequisite: RN102 or equivalent

The primary focus of this course is practical application. Students will be challenged to explore their own personal filters, attitudes and beliefs as they develop their chart interpretation skills. They will actively consider and discuss potential client issues and ethical considerations. In addition, students get guidance in how to evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of different approaches to delineation by examining how multiple astrologers approach chart interpretation. Students will benefit from two sessions of exposure to the methodology developed by veteran astrologer Susie Cox. This is a simplistic but powerful visual and linguistic approach to chart synthesis.

Students will

- Develop critical thinking skills through examining conflicting views and asking questions about varying subjects such as dignities, sect, existence of good or bad planets and house placements
- Identify characteristics of effective and ineffective astrologers
- Practice with multiple approaches to delineation
- Learn to identify personal filters and those related to the natal chart
- Practice techniques for blending chart components such as the Sun, Moon and Ascendant
- Identify and use essential and accidental dignities to differentiate between expressions of planetary essence and strength in the natal chart
- Learn how to differentiate the quality of aspects through consideration of variations in planetary relationships by their nature and placement in the chart
- Learn how dispositors, time lords, planetary speed, and derivative houses can enhance chart interpretation
- Begin to understand how to use profections and transits to activate the chart

RN104 Fundamentals IV: Chart Synthesis - a Practicum

Students who have completed this course will receive a Fundamentals Certificate.

Instructors: Tamira McGillivray, Morgan Garriott plus guest instructors

Required for the Professional Diploma This is a Practicum. Attendance is required

Prerequisite: RN103 or comparable and accepted outside training

This course focuses on synthesis and application. Students will work on finding basic themes, answers and interpretations using the natal chart to address client issues. By the end,

students will have increased confidence in their interpretation skills, be better able to identify major life issues and focus on answering specific who, what, where and when questions raised by clients. They will also better understand the principal ethical issues in astrological sessions.

Students will:

- Gain an understanding of their style in how they engage and approach a natal chart through critical thinking and peer review.
- Learn why the client-first philosophy is crucial to rapport building and setting expectations for a successful reading.
- Create their own systematic approach to client consultations in a natal reading.
- Identify and communicate the core themes of the native's life through aspect patterns, planetary strength, and zodiacal positions.
- Understand and identify where to look in the birth chart for common client concerns and questions raised such as love, money, career, or health.
- Network and explore various astrologers approaches into the birth chart.
- Practice communication skills and rapport building through active demonstrations of chart interpretations.

Extensive practice, class participation, and critical thinking are needed. Ethics and counseling tools will be explored so practitioners feel comfortable with common dilemmas, how to use self-as-instrument, rapport building, and communication skills. By the end of class, students will be comfortable isolating the most important parts of a chart and understand how to tailor their approach to meet their client's needs.

Predictive Certificate

Prerequisite: A solid working knowledge of the fundamentals of natal chart interpretation.

Required for KPDA (Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology)

Overview:

The movement courses cover ancient to modern techniques of interpreting planetary cycles

emphasizing WHEN the natal chart is activated. Combining the WHAT with the WHEN is essential to successful astrological practice. Students will explore the advantages and disadvantages of the various forecasting techniques used in the range of astrology's historical traditions to clarify, for themselves, the tradition that best serves their interpretive outlook and their client's needs. In addition to weekly homework practice and discussion board participation, live chat sessions focus on interactive participation. Student presentations demonstrate learning.

- Compared the strengths and weaknesses of various predictive timing techniques and selected the ones preferred for regular use.
- •Practiced layering several movement techniques to confirm the timing forecast of what is activated in the natal chart, to what extent, and for how long.

RP201: Transits

Instructors: Celeste Brooks

Required for Predictive Certificate and Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology

Prerequisite: Must have a working fundamental knowledge of Planets, Zodiac Signs, Houses, and Aspects.

First course to take

The natal chart is a snapshot of the planets at the moment of birth. Transits occur when orbiting planets activate the natal chart. The art of prediction includes organizing, prioritizing, and communicating, which transits will result in changes in the inner and outer worlds. In this class, you will learn timing techniques, including annual profections, planetary retrogrades, lunations, and eclipses. Students will receive the tools to create a year forecast.

Weekly Topics:

- Week 1: Transit Fundamentals Introduction to analyzing and organizing planetary transits. Instruction on prioritizing timing events with annual profections.
- Week 2: Retrograde Cycles Learn how to use an ephemeris. Understanding the importance of shadows, stations, and planetary retrogrades.
- Week 3: Lunations, Eclipses, and the Lunar Nodes Harness the predictive power of the solar-lunar relationship.
- Week 4: Cycles of Becoming Understanding the synodic cycles and important agerelated transits.
- Week 5: Mapping the Future Creating a year-ahead forecast.

RP202 Progressions and Solar Arcs

Primary Instructors: Joseph Crane, Enid Newberg

Required Predictive Certificate and the Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology

Prerequisite: A working knowledge of the fundamentals of natal interpretation and synthesis.

Secondary Progressions is a predictive method which moves the entire natal chart forward a day for each year of life. Solar Arc Directions calculates a similar predictive chart based on the sun's daily movement alone. Both can be used with transits and solar returns to clarify a person's circumstances and decisions. What is the range of applications, and what are the limitations of these methods? How do they work with transits and solar returns?

We first look at the nuts and bolts of calculating secondary progressions, especially the progressed Midheaven. Class participants are encouraged to work

with progressions from their own charts and lives, those of family and close friends, or historical or contemporary people they know well.

Weekly topics:

- 1. Background, historical review from the viewpoint of "progressing" the angles, place of secondaries within traditional predictive methods. Scope and limitations.
- 2. Progressing Moon in context of natal placement, progressed lunation cycle.
- 3. Applications focus on interpreting changes in signs and direction. Adjusted Calculating Date.
- 4. Applications perfecting natal aspects and including progressed aspect configurations.
- 5. Progressions and solar arc directions in today's astrology.

An alternative to secondary progressions is solar arc directions, which are preferred by many contemporary astrologers. They are calculated and applied differently from Secondary Progressions and deserve a closer look. At the end of the course, we'll compare methods and outcomes.

RP204 Solar Returns

Instructors: Shu Yap

Required for W112A or W113A Required for the Professional Diploma

Prerequisite: A solid knowledge of astrology fundamentals and W110 or proof of equivalent training in movement techniques

Solar Returns or Revolutions is a forecasting technique based on a chart cast at the moment the Sun returns to its natal position in any year of inquiry. This predictive method has been used for centuries, and over this time, many interpretive techniques have evolved out of it.

Solar Returns is appealing because it neatly encapsulates a 12-month perspective into one chart, in relation to a natal chart. As it also draws from the same fundamental principles of natal chart analysis, Solar Returns is a great way to extend and build on your existing skills in natal astrology.

In this 5-week short course, we will explore some fundamental principles behind Solar Return charts to help you build some skills to start working with them in your study and practice. Many of the core principles used in natal chart analysis are also used within the Solar Returns system, but some adjustments are required to reframe these principles within the context of a one-year time slice. Foundational skills in natal astrology are required.

RP301 Practicum: Applied Rectification

Without accurate birth time, an astrologer's forecast for the client could be off by a year or more, which is not professionally acceptable.

Even with a birth certificate, all birth times should be tested because of the worldwide recording disparity. Testing ensures that the ANGLES of the chart are confirmed by movement techniques that show the activation of the natal chart at dates of major life events. If they don't, the astrologer and client can determine if rectification of the birth time is needed and what is to be accomplished by the search. To rectify the chart, the client often needs to be asked for additional information about specific life-turning points based on his or her memory, records, family, and/or friends.

Common problems with recorded birth time accuracy are:

Times rounded to the quarter-hour,

Times recorded in standard time by statute, when daylight time was in effect,

Clock and watch variances and

Birthtime is not a priority for the medical staff.

By the end of this course, students will be able to apply various chart movement techniques to align appropriate chart patterns and astrological significators to actual life events, from a few minutes of known birth time to a 6-hour search. They will learn the important areas of practice and controversy in rectification, demonstrate knowledge of timing techniques, evaluate activated natal chart angles at important events, and derive a time that can consistently be repeated and aligned with major events.

Advanced astrology software that can search various movement methods, such as Solar Fire 9, Sirius 3.0, Time Passages, and others, is highly recommended. Jigsaw (a research program) is not required.

RP302 Practicum: Rectification 24 hour

RP220 Prediction Practicum: The Art of Forecasting

Instructors: Kathy Rose

Attendance is required for this course

RP301 OR RP302 OR RP220 are required for the Predictive Certificate and the Kepler Professional Diploma

Prerequisite: This course requires Full working knowledge and deep understanding of transits and solar arcs.

The Astrologer has a special vantage point for being able to move forward or backward in time—viewing the developmental patterns for the client by noting when the natal chart is activated.

Understanding past cycles and life development can anticipate how past and future cycles offer growth. We establish and understand the foundation upon which the client's life is built, and then we look ahead.

This course offers a mindful orientation on how to communicate in future cycles.

Predicting and forecasting relies on the principle "Do no harm". Wisdom must prevail in word choice, message, and potential.

Learn:

- How to establish a systematic approach to integrating transits and solar arcs
- Mindful and ethical communication of upcoming cycles
- Simplification... identifying what is most important

Weekly Topics:

1. Fate or Free Will?

A very large part of prediction is anticipating behaviour. First, we must learn how the person is living their chart. We must always remember the human in the horoscope. One interpretation of a key outer planet transit or solar arc does not fit all. The horoscope adjusts its level of manifestation, and the astrologer must adjust analysis.

Next we must consider the ethical implications for the message we present related to projections and interpretations of future cycles. We will discuss the power and implications of the Self-Fulfilling Prophecy. This class will also focus on the importance of the inner development of the client—and the reminder that all activation from transits or solar arcs is designed to create learning opportunities.

2. The Hierarchy of Measurement: Knowing What is Important

It's very easy to get overwhelmed by the multiplicity of measurements. In this class, we focus on simplifying and appreciating the most powerful aspects and activation of the horoscope by transits or solar arcs. The strongest cycles produce the biggest

ripples for growth and life activity. Learning how to organize and evaluate the KEY signals rather than getting lost in the multiplicity of measurements is vital.

3. The Frequency and Energetic Signature of the Planets

When there is contact by transit or solar arc, we are "receiving" the frequency from the planet acting on the natal. We must deeply understand the unique energetic signal from the cycle—and what that planetary energy is trying to achieve as it activates the natal chart.

Next, we focus on synthesizing complex cases where many cycles overlap during a year. Formulating an organized, systematic approach for notation and analysis is key. Case examples will be shared, and illuminating patterns will be revealed.

4. Big Bells / little bells: Fine Tuning Timing

Big Bells are the outer planet transits or any solar arc. These cycles present the theme of development for longer periods. Little bells are contacted from the inner planets; secondary progressed Moon aspects, eclipses, or lunations. These are triggers or activators of the developmental themes going on for the client.

We will focus on timing and isolating the ACTIVE power periods during any given year. Case examples will be shared illustrating timing for deals, contracts, job offers, moves, trips, or real estate transactions—projected in advance due to little bell activity.

5. The Art of Synthesis: Fine Tuning the Process

We will explore specific solar arcs or transits that might cause the astrologer to gasp—the heavy, seemingly difficult periods we can see in advance. Communicating the potential requires wisdom and mindfulness.

Many planetary combinations suggest the potential for positive growth; we will discuss these lighter energetic cycles. We will also present a deep dive into the considerations of the client's age and reality related to how a cycle may manifest.

Case studies will be shared, especially examples of surprises in what a cycle brought about in life development.

RP203 Working with the Moon

Instructors: Tara Aal and Aswin Subramanyans RP203 is required for the Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology

Prerequisite: Basic understanding of planets, signs, houses and aspects.

Students will learn the foundational basics of using the Moon in predictive work, and feel confident in their ability to immediately apply what they learn to their astrological practice.

Weekly Topics:

- 1. **Electional Rules for the Moon & Void of Course Moon:** Learn the basic electional rules for working with the Moon and what to expect with the Void of Course Moon.
- 2. **Moon Phases & Progressed Moon Phases:** Review the eight soli-lunar phases and how they show where one is at in a given cycle. Learn how the progressed Moon reveals the current phase in a 30-year cycle of living one's purpose.
- 3. Lunar Returns & Progressed Lunar Returns: Learn about lunar returns and progressed lunar returns. Be able to predict the types of things likely to happen at these times.
- 4. **Eclipses & Saros Cycles:** Learn the foundations of eclipses and Saros cycles—what they signal, how they help us spotlight the past and future, and how the light of the Sun and Moon work together.
- 5. **Nakshatras:** Learn the basics of Nakshatras and how to implement this in predictive work.

RP205 Electional Astrology

Student Presentations

E205 Symmetry in Astrology - Self Study

Mentor: Bruce Scofield

E205 is a Diploma elective

Prerequisite: Basic understanding of planets, signs, houses and aspects.

This course considers a range of astrological techniques that share a common principle – symmetry, which is quite a few.

A major part of the course will concern itself with an organized set of techniques entirely based on positioning points and planets at equal distances from each other. These techniques have an ancient pedigree in the form of antiscia and parts, but they blossomed in the 20th century as the core principle of the Hamburg School, or Uranian Astrology. This development, surely one of the most important technical developments of the entire century, has had a profound influence on modern astrology in Europe and the eastern United States. More than half of this course will work directly with Uranian methods and techniques.

By the end of this course, students will have a good understanding of the importance of symmetrical techniques and how they are applied. They will also be able to use the techniques covered to hone their astrological interpretations and obtain more specific information to answer questions by clients.

E206 Zodiacal Releasing

Instructor: Gray Crawford **E206** is a Diploma elective

Pre-requisites:

- Watch the free Kepler College webinar by Gray Crawford entitled "Points of Destiny: Using the
 Lots of Daimon and Fortune in Your Practice," available on the Kepler College YouTube channel
 here
- Must have an understanding of natal astrology fundamentals and foundational concepts
- It is important to have at least a beginning level of understanding of Hellenistic astrology and concepts such as whole sign houses, sect (day versus night charts), and assessing the planetary condition

Students will:

- Understand the meaning of the Lot of Fortune and Lot of Spirit and how they relate to zodiacal releasing
- Demonstrate understanding of the timing sequences used in zodiacal releasing
- Be able to identify peak periods of activity related to the Lot of Spirit

Gain skills in evaluating and interpreting:

- the quality of time indicated by zodiacal releasing through interpretation of the activated signs and rulers
- the meaning of one zodiacal releasing time period switching over to another in sequence
- the meaning of Level 2 time periods and how they interact in relation to Level 1 period
- the meaning of level 3 periods in relation to level 1 and 2 periods
- the significance of loosing of the bonds time periods

Learn to identify significant periods of time indicated by zodiacal releasing to emphasize to clients.

Weekly Topics:

- Timelord techniques, the Lots of Fortune and Spirit as fundamental concepts underlying zodiacal releasing, the timing structure and sequence of zodiacal releasing, identifying peak periods.
- 2. Interpretation of major time periods (Level 1) and evaluating when supportive and challenging influences are activated; interpreting the major periods changing from one sign and timelord to another; identifying peak periods of activity and associated angular triads.
- 3. Interpretation of time periods that are "subperiods" on Level 2, evaluating the meaning of level 2 timelords and how they interact with the overall timelord on level 1, introduction of loosing of the bonds and how it will show up on Level 2.
- 4. Evaluating and interpreting loosing of the bonds on level 2, continued practice integrating level 2 time periods with level 1 and use of angular triads, introduction to integrating the level 3 signs and timelords with level 1 and level 2.
- 5. Integrating the level 3 signs and timelords with level 1 and level 2, introduction of level 4 signs and timelords with regard to specific events.

E303 Advanced Progressions: Converse, Tertiary, & Minor

Instructors: Jenn Zahrt, Cameron Cassidy **E206 is a Diploma elective**

E200 is a Dipioma elective

Pre-requisites: Advanced. Students should have fluency in calculating and interpreting secondary progressions.

Take progressions to whole new levels in this new elective at Kepler College! Advanced Progressions introduces you to tertiary, minor, and converse progressions, looking at how their cycles interact and layer in timing synthesis. We will then dive into how you incorporate fixed stars and lunar mansions with progressions for stellar accuracy!

Course Content:

WEEK 1: We begin with tertiary progressions, which equate a day of transits to a month of life. By identifying powerful configurations, you will learn how to identify and delineate active periods and layer them with secondary progressions. WEEK 2 covers the minor (or quaternary) progression, equating a month of transits to a year of life. You will learn and apply the metaphysical time ratios linking the three major levels of progression. WEEK 3: Back to the future... with converse progressions! Calculate and interpret converse progressions at the secondary and tertiary levels. By this third week, you should be able to identify critical/sensitive times (related to these progressions) in your head without an ephemeris. WEEK 4: Add the bright fixed stars and the 28 lunar mansions to your progression toolkit. Major events in progressed charts will become characterized with extreme precision through the fixed stars and the celestial images in which they occur. WEEK 5: In our final week, we will put it all together and learn how to prepare for consultations and/or research purposes.

By the end of this course, you will be able to identify nesting levels of unfolding time. You can successfully evaluate evidence to delineate charts through time (both forward and backward) with increasing accuracy and sensitivity. In addition, you will be able to synthesize advanced forms of progression with the application of fixed stars and lunar mansions.

E310 Mundane Astrology for Political Elections (every 4 years)

Instructors: Lee Lehman *E310 is a Diploma elective*

Pre-requisites: Completion of RA301 (Mundane Astrology), or permission by instructor. Must feel comfortable with spreadsheets and Zoom sharing. General astrology software mandatory. Chart files will be provided in Solar Fire Format. Do not plan to take this course for credit unless you can attend most or all of the live classes.

Astrologers generally only address political election predictions ad hoc when an election is imminent. This course presents a systematic approach to learning the factors that could improve accuracy if studied as a general approach.

By the end of this course, students will understand the method of designing ways to study the astrology of political elections in a way where the results are objective. They will have acquired experience addressing specific time-related questions that are unique for different countries or other mundane entities. They will have worked with models for defining factors which may produce predictable results using both mundane events and natal considerations.

Weekly Topics:

- 1. The Mundane Factors regarding an election are examined with historical data provided. Learning objectives: 1. Learn how to research the mundane mechanics of an election 2. Test your data to examine synodic factors 3. Create a rubric for the examination of election charts
- 2. Classifying Results into categories that can be studied Learning objectives: 1. Adjust the rubric you began to study last week as you add favorite or home arguments 2. Begin to compare election day charts with solar and lunar factors in the rules of gaming and War 3. Begin to compare election day charts with the usual mundane dates in the rules of gaming and war
- 3. Unique effects of Eclipses Learning objectives: 1. Adjust the rubric you began to study in the first week as you now consider whether it is better to study the prior eclipse or whether an eclipse is within Lilly's time range of the effectiveness of an eclipse. 2. Consider how to pick the factors you would like to study. 3. Reach conclusions about the historical interpretation of eclipse length
- 4. Designing a Model. Assigning Points Learning objectives: 1. Learn how assigning variable points can impact results 2. Consider the difference between using specific but unusual factors vs. more common lower-pointed factors 3. Create a best-case model with pointing inserted into your model
- 5. Charts of Contestants Assimilation Assignment: database of US presidential candidates natal charts Learning objectives: 1. Using the mundane models examined so far, examine the paired nativities for success factors at the time of their contest 2. Compare timed charts to solar charts to consider whether it is possible to work with untimed data

In this five-week course, students will:

- Understand the method of dividing up time into useful time periods for study
- Acquire experience in several methods of assessing the outlines of particular years and likely events
- Critically examine whether a time period is likely to produce significant events

Weekly Topics:

- ♦ The Planets, Signs and Houses in Mundane Astrology
 - Experience the basic astrological model for working with mundane charts
 - Identify the key questions that mundane can address
 - Create a rubric for the examination of mundane questions
 - Begin to examine how astronomy impacts the mundane interpretation
- ♦ Eclipses and Lunations in Mundane Astrology
 - Adjust the rubric you began to study last week as you now compare Aries Ingresses to eclipses.
 - Begin to consider the different time periods encompassed by mundane methods.
 - Consider the interpretive differences introduced by irregular eclipse periods based on the nodal cycle

 - Practice expanding the time period of study by examining past Jupiter-Saturn and Mars-Saturn periods.

R110: Chart Calculation

Instructor: Enid Newberg

Required for the Professional Diploma

Only offered in the summer term.

This instructor-guided course gives students a deeper understanding of how the chart relates to the earth's and sky's movements, which aids chart interpretation.

The first portion of this course covers calculating a natal chart. Students will learn to calculate charts from time zones around the world, including the Northern and Southern hemispheres. The course's second portion adds calculation techniques, including the lots.

The course is organized for independent self-study and has live meetings during the term for students to ask questions directly and review the material. Students can also request 1-hour of private tutoring.

Use this course if you intend to take the organizational exams, complete the Professional Diploma, or simply want to know more about how a chart is calculated.

ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

R111 Astronomy for Astrologers (independent study)

Instructor: Bruce Scofield

R111 OR R115 are required for the Professional Diploma

Self-paced independent class (you will have 4 months to complete)

Astronomy is the study of the nature, motions, and history of the Earth's cosmic environment. It is a highly developed science that encompasses many technical subjects. This course emphasizes subject matter relevant to a general and nontechnical understanding of astronomy. It is a unique introduction to astronomy and would benefit students of astrology or anyone seeking a practical overview of the subject.

This self-motivated course requires the student to set aside time each week to study the material presented. Learning in this course depends on reviewing the assigned readings, listening to the lectures, and doing the weekly assignments. The readings overlap with the lectures and provide additional information. The assignments are based primarily on the lectures, which set the parameters of each week's topic. In addition to the lectures and assigned readings, the course assignments include online forums, multiple-choice questions, and a short report on a relevant topic.

The course begins with a week on cosmology—how the universe came into being. The current Big Bang model will be covered. This will be followed by a few weeks on the sky as it appears from Earth and how it is measured. We will consider the three basic coordinate systems used in astronomy and astrology and how ancient peoples measured the sky.

Course Objectives:

Upon completing the course, you should have a solid foundation in astronomy and a better understanding of how the subject developed historically and where it is today. You will understand the astronomy of ancient cultures and how astronomy is used in mapping the sky. RC211 Counsulting Skills

10 week course

RC210 or RC211 are required for the Counseling and Relationship Certificate and Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

You may know how to read an astrology chart, but it takes great awareness to synthesize it and effectively communicate the wisdom to your clients. How do you begin a consultation? How do you speak about challenging configurations? How do you address different cultural contexts? Astrology can be very revealing, transformative, and even powerful, but as a practitioner, you must know how to deliver this information in ways that empower your clients and certainly do no harm. This essential program will make you a better and more confident astrologer.

Over 10 weeks we will explore how to create a supportive environment and work on the most effective communication skills: how to properly develop rapport and find the right balance between engaging the client in dialogue and giving the astrological interpretations. This process requires mindfulness, inner work, and deepened awareness on the part of the astrologer. We will reflect on personal issues that may influence our client interactions. We will explore common challenges related to ethics, boundaries, cross-cultural issues, and the unconscious effect of language, personal beliefs, and philosophies as we deepen both awareness and practical skills.

This class will have lectures, group discussions, meditation, inner work, and time to practice giving and receiving readings with our peers.

There will be a cap of 15 to 18 participants.

This class is an OPA Consulting Skills parallel and will count towards OPA's Certification Program.

C202 Working with Parents and Children

Instructor: Cornelia Hansen

This course can be used as an Elective toward Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

An astrological chart, which has ancient origins, is used to determine an individual's psychological temperament. This course applies that knowledge to better understand children. It is a new approach to looking at temperament using modern child development concepts. The analysis learned in this course can also be used for adult charts and is especially useful for work on compatibility or couple counseling.

Applying astrological and modern child development concepts of temperament, this course provides students with a new approach to looking at

- How analyzing and interpreting a child's chart differs from an adult's,
- Identifying temperamental "types" and their characteristics,
- Identifying parenting strategies that can more effectively meet a child's individual needs
- The lifelong influences and effects of temperament on behavior
- How an astrologer can counsel parents in a way that promotes positive developmental progress.
- Possible uses of temperament information in making comparisons among both children and adults, plus applications for couple's counseling

This course is designed to help the astrologer understand where there is or is not a good fit between the child and his/her physical and social environment and what that entails.

C203 Family Patterns and Chart Interpretation

Instructors: Joseph Crane and Enid Newberg

This course can be used as an Elective toward Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

This course offers practical guidance for astrologers working with family issues, including parents, children, siblings, and extended relationships, both their own and clients'. Family relationships form much of the background complexity of a person's life: they set patterns that manifest in relationships with bosses and subordinates, close friends and intimates, and in our career and lifestyle choices.

This course will go beyond the "nuclear family" to consider the social, ethnic, and historical contexts of family life. Students will sample psychodynamic approaches that inform much modern astrology and

systems approach that enable an exploration of the interlocking patterns of our birth and family connections.

Students will examine parental/offspring and sibling relationships within family structures through the astrological chart. They will look at generational transmission, sibling position, and changes within the family to see how astrological indicators reflect these considerations and how they might run counter to them.

Participants are invited to share cases they have encountered in their work and insights from their own family experiences and lives.

C204 Illuminating Relationships II: Composites & Davison

Instructor: Dorothy Oja

Astrology can provide great insight into the basic dynamics of love and marriage. This course will cover techniques, psychological principles, psychological issues, and ethical concerns and considerations.

C205 Relationships 101

Instructor: Karen McCauley and Inga Thornell

This course can be used as an Elective toward Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

Students will look at relationships primarily through charts of individuals and couples. We will differentiate needs from wants and abilities. Students will also explore issues that arise between astrologer and client(s).

C206 Introduction to Psychological Astrology

Instructor: Margaret Gray

This course can be used as an Elective toward Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

Know Thyself is the first rule of client work. Get ready to learn more about yourself through the lens of Jungian Psychological Astrology. In this class, we do a deep dive by exploring astrological foundations of elements and modalities, and how they drive our personality and life choices. Students will explore their own natal chart for self-discovery and working with the MBTI (Myers Briggs Inventory). We will explore interpretations of planets in signs, the difference between the natal promise, and how the individual can evolve over time with their chart. Through discussions, reading, process journaling, and case studies, students will gain insights into self-understanding and client work.

C207 Illuminating Relationships

Instructor: Dorothy Oja

This course can be used as an Elective toward Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

First, we'll start with ourselves to understand our relationship nature.

In subsequent classes, we'll examine the key places in the chart that indicate a person's natural tendencies or inclination toward interacting with others in various relationship dynamics.

We will continue further to explore synastry, or how one person's chart impacts and interacts with the chart of another.

By the end of the course, you will have a solid basic understanding of how to analyze and delineate both a person's essential relationship nature and their potential impact on others.

Symmetrical Astrology

Many of astrology's fundamental principles are based on symmetry. Best known is the distribution of signs by element and quality, a scheme based on equal distances along the ecliptic that produces perfect triangles and squares.

E205 Symmetry in Astrology 1 (Independent Study)

Instructor: Bruce Scofield

This course can be used as an Elective toward the Alternative Traditions Certificate and Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

This course considers a range of astrological techniques that share a common principle – symmetry, which is quite a few.

A major part of the course will concern itself with an organized set of techniques entirely based on positioning points and planets at equal distances from each other. These techniques have an ancient pedigree in the form of antisica and parts, but they blossomed in the 20th century as the core principle of the Hamburg School, or Uranian Astrology. This development, surely one of the most important technical developments of the entire century, has had a profound influence on modern astrology in Europe and in the eastern United States. Over half of this course will work directly with Uranian methods and techniques.

By the end of this course, students will have a good understanding of the importance of symmetrical techniques and how they are applied. They will also be able to use the techniques covered to hone their astrological interpretations and obtain more specific information to answer questions from clients.

E203 Introduction to Uranian Astrology

Instructor: TBD

- the use of the dials, midpoints and planetary pictures in synastry.

- ♦ Explore how changes in 20th century philosophy and science affected the arts and sciences, and how 21st century research is moving toward a more inclusive world view.

By the end of this course, students will have a greater appreciation of astrology's role in the development of modern science and its interaction with religion, philosophy and the arts.

RH115 Astrological Heritage: Babylonian to Hellenistic

Prerequisites: none

This course begins with the Late Renaissance and the Enlightenment. Most people believe that this is when belief in astrology died out in the West, but in actual fact ephemerides and astrological almanacs were among the first books to be printed on the new Gutenberg printing presses, right after the famous Gutenberg Bible. This 5 week course offers a survey of the historical periods up to the present incorporating astrologically significant events and discoveries.

This course will help students to understand how astrology continued to fit into the cultural milieu of each sequential historical period. Students will also be introduced to concepts such as Philosophy of Science, Comparative Religion, Theosophy, New Age and Postmodernism.

In this course, students will:

- See how astrology was embedded in mainstream culture and utilized on a regular basis
- Study how different astrological lineages and various cultural movements impacted the development of modern astrology
- Critique the intellectual shifts in religion and philosophy that led to the modern scientific and secular worldview, and the rejection of intuitive ways of knowing

 Explore how changes in 20th-century philosophy and science affected the arts and sciences, and how 21st-century research is moving toward a more inclusive world view

Weekly topics:

- 4. Theosophical Enlightenment
- 5. 20th Century and beyond

H102 Introduction to Astro-Mythology

This course is an elective for the Astrological Heritage Certificate and Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

Prerequisites: none

The Greco-Roman gods are our foundation for understanding the Olympian gods and goddesses, the basis of our astrology.

This five-week course will focus on individual gods—their attributes, spheres of influence, and their interactions with each other and with human beings—to develop an understanding of the origins of the astrological keywords and meanings we rely on for interpretation.

The links between mythology and astrology are deeper than just the names of the gods and the signs. Knowing more about our heritage and our antecedents can deepen not only our appreciation but also the practice of our astrological art and science.

H103 Astrologies of Soul: Foundations of Character

Instructor: Joseph Crane and Enid Newbergl

This course is an elective for the Astrological Heritage Certificate, Alternative Traditions Certificate, and Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

Prerequisites: none

This 5-week course explores basic planetary symbolism to capture the dynamics of who we are and how we can flourish.

These difficult times provide an opportunity for personal reflection and new learning opportunities. This course looks at different perspectives on personal identity and character as they relate directly to our astrological symbolism - in a way more profound than you can imagine.

In an unusual alliance with some trends in modern psychology, this course investigates why we say someone is a "good soul" and how the cracks and breaks in the soul express "character flaws." We also explore what diminishes, or even kills soul – and how it can come back to life. These ideas form the bedrock of "the good life" and how we can act in harmony with ourselves and the larger world.

The course also draws core material from the ancient world that saw the soul or psyche in a variety of perspectives: body and mind together, animating breath and life force, a basic form that may exist alongside and may outlive the body, or as an identity that reveals itself to others and lives among others in the larger world. Psyche and soul also represented states of being and expressed an immortal essence transcending our identities.

Through five weeks of live meetings and a course site with written discussion forums to continue the conversations started during the live meetings, as well as readings and videos, students will grow their understanding of how astrology incorporates these concepts and how this understanding can enliven and deepen astrological interpretation.

Topics covered include:

- -Matters of Life and Death: Psyche, Zombies and Ghosts, the Afterlife and Astrology's Sun
- -Body and Soul, Temperament and the Rhythms of Life
- -How Soul Weakens and Dies and how it Heals
- -In the Community: Human Flourishing in the Larger World
- -Ego and Self in Modern Psychology and Astrology

Our emphasis is not on advocating a specific point of view but to engage in meaningful conversation, generate deeper exploration and contemplation, and offering astrologers further tools for meaningful interpretation.

H104 Calling and the Soul's Transformations

Instructor: Joseph Crane and Enid Newbergl

This course is an elective for the Astrological Heritage Certificate, Alternative Traditions Certificate, and Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

Prerequisites: none

Most people have experienced a calling to reach for something greater than themselves and participate in the larger world. We don't always succeed, but astrology can help.

In ordinary experience, our primary interactions with the world are through our daily work, our jobs, or our careers. But this may not be the same as being "called" to a particular type of action or work.

Astrologers have been concerned with these matters for centuries. In this course, we will ponder the differences between the Midheaven and the 10th house, what other houses play a role in calling and vocation, the guidance from the positions of the Sun and Lot of Spirit, determining the planetary daimon as what planet guides the astrological chart.

H105 Astrology, Rebirth and Spiritual Life

Instructor: Joseph Crane and Enid Newbergl

This course is an elective for the Astrological Heritage Certificate, Alternative Traditions Certificate, and Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

No external texts are required for this course

Prerequisites: none

In the third course of this series, students will examine the soul as an entity that survives death. They will explore ideas about the revolving or evolving Soul, our sense that we are more than just our bodies, that something somehow survives the death of the body, and the question of whether we have been here before.

What happens when we die? Do we exist in some form that we can call "me"? Is there an eternal destination or do we come back into another life? These have been concerns from Neolithic time to the present and our interest in these matters is perhaps part of being human. Astrology, because of its focus on the moment of birth and because it refers to the visible heavens, is relevant to these matters.

Weekly topics include:

- Background on Eastern and Western ideas on reincarnation
- The Theosophical movement and its incorporation of reincarnation
- Esoteric astrology, Alice Bailey and reframing astrology in the early 1900's
- Dane Rudhyar's galaxy
- Spiritual and Evolutionary astrology

H106 Sacred Paths Through the Written Word: Western

Instructor: Carol Tebbsk

Follow astrology down the sacred paths in the written word. The greatest collection of works on the soul and, surprisingly, its intersection with astrological concepts, come from traditional religions. And where else can you explore the Torah, New Testament, and the Koran and discuss astrology?

This 5-week course explores the belief that the firmament has a correlation to conditions on earth and man through passages from the Jewish Torah, the Christian New Testament, and the Islamic Koran. Each week students will explore the astrology references in the sacred literature and explore the related arguments for natural science versus support for astrology and/or refutation of it.

Literature has long been the vehicle to establish and maintain cultural identity through stories of origin, heroes, and history. These stories in time become mythology or even codified sacred literature. You may not realize, but the three primary Western religions all have astrology embedded in their sacred works. If you have an interest in spiritual traditions or do soul work with your clients, take advantage of this unique course now! You won't find anything like it anywhere else!

Astrology got it right, what's wrong with the rest of the world?" quipped a well-known astrologer when discussing the connection between sacred literature and the common phrase, "As above, so below." This has been a phrase understood by every astrologer from ancient to modern times. Indeed, the concept has roots in much of the world's sacred literature.'

H107 Sacred Paths Through the Written Word: Eastern

Instructor: Carol Tebbs

This sacred literature course explores works from the East that describe the acceptance of a relationship between the cosmos and life on earth. Students are introduced to common themes found in selections from the literature of three major Eastern religions: Hinduism via The Rig Veda, Upanishads, Bhagavad-Gita, and Ramayana; Buddhism via The Wheel of Life (story of Siddhartha), and

Dhammapada; Confucianism via the Analects, I-Ching, and Tao Te-Ching (an off-shoot of Confucianism). Students will compare the sacred works according to themes such as creation, life challenges, the fall of man, divine punishment, the rewards of virtue, and the power of love.

H106 or H107 may be taken for expanding cultural understanding OR as an elective for the Diploma program, which will also count toward a certificate in Astrological Heritage OR Multi-Cultural Traditions.

Astrology of Healing Certificate

This program aims to prepare consultants to provide astrologically informed insight into the Astrology of Healing; insights into **body, mind,** and **spirit** matters.

All courses at Kepler College are taught in English unless noted otherwise. Proficiency in English is required for all students.

Attendance may be required in some of the classes.

Prerequisite: Kepler Fundamentals Certificate or equivalent

Certificate Requirements: 40 weeks of study

Overview:

The Astrology of Healing Certificate courses address the questions surrounding medical astrology. This will encompass horary and decumbiture charts, the currency of great astrologers like Abraham ibn Ezra and Nicholas Culpeper. For all but the last roughly 100 years, the word medicine was understood as applying to any of hundreds of methods to relieve the human condition related to the many diseases that our bodies, minds, and spirits encounter in our journeys through this Earth. No one school or philosophy of medicine had right or priority, much less legal and professional right of priority. In our foundational courses in this program, we will present the history of how this happened and what impact it has on us, both as practitioners of the art and as personal users of it.

Because these society-wide changes have resulted in our possessing less than full professional autonomy, we are opting here to use the wording, Astrology of Healing, which is legally unreserved. But like any attempt to use language with precision, it also has its disadvantages. Within the New Age community, which includes astrology, that phrase implies a viewpoint that is not exactly what we mean here. You might call our usage here "lower case" – we are not advocating a hierarchy of the three concepts infinitely entwined with belief systems, but a continued reverence for the long path that carries our journey to self-understanding, healing, and acceptance. Some adherents may work on strictly physical matters; others may work on mental or spiritual; all seek a place of health and well-being, and all see astrology as a means of practice, understanding, and support.

Program objectives:

Compare and contrast knowledge of the historical practices of astrology with a focus on Hippocratic and Galenic medicine and related systems of thought, astrological rulerships, and pattern recognition principles.

Describe Hippocratic, Aristotelian, and Stoic systems of humoral thought.

Compare historical applications and how this medical diaspora were syncretized with astrological principles.

Apply astrological analysis and critical thought to enhance applications of historical medical and non-orthodox protocols designed to enhance the client's bodily, mental, or spiritual experience.

Use timing principles to astrologically inform elections, prognoses, procedures, wellness programs, and prognoses for enhanced experience, wellness, and amelioration.

Situate their practice within the astrological culture and that of the communities of care.

MPC301 Foundations of the History of Medical Astrology – 10 weeks

Prerequisite for course: Fundamentals Certificate or equivalent

Study the historical practices of astrology with a focus on Hippocratic and Galenic medicine. Explore astrology's advent, essential developments, and the foundational personalities within systems of medical thought and care.

MPC306 Elements, Humors, Temperaments

MPC316 Melothesia: Astrological Anatomy

Instructor: Kira Sutherland

This course will introduce each astrological sign and planet's basic rulerships and body parts. We will begin with each sign and its corresponding body parts, organs and physiological rulership. The second part of the class focuses on the anatomy and physiology of the traditional planets.

Anatomy, physiology and Melothesia

MPC321 Melothesia: Astrological Anatomy

Instructor: Marcos Patchett

This course is the first half of a module teaching the traditional art of decumbiture and medical consultation chart interpretation. Students will be introduced to many of the principal figures in the Renaissance astrological tradition and their work. The course covers key differences and similarities between consultation charts, decumbiture, and horary charts. Ethical and practical limitations of astrological prognosis will be discussed; techniques will include the use of reception, crisis charts, and horary predictive techniques in defining astrological prognosis, in addition to general remediation or counsel which may be adduced from the astrological chart.

MPC331 Model of Astrological Analysis

Instructor: Lee Lehman

Course Objectives:

The purpose of this course is to present the traditional model for the assessment of health, vitality, and disease using the nativity. Students will learn to assess the nativity using principles for judging the strengths and weaknesses of the chart as understood in traditional medical astrology.

From identifying your talents by reflecting on the hidden gems in your own chart, to contributing to Kepler College's blog, you'll be working as part of team to create a full year of Sun Sign columns.

Weekly topics:

- Your First and Tenth Houses Building our team brand and finding your place within it
- Your Fifth and Sixth Houses Planning our collaborative work for Kepler College, monthly and weekly columns
- Unleashing Your Creativity Peer reviewing, daily columns
- Marketing and Making Money

PD301 Fundamentals of Life Coaching for Astrologers

Instructor: Marie O'Neill

No Prerequisites

This course can be applied to the Professional Development Certificate and an elective for the Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

Life Coaching and astrology are a perfect fit for a counseling astrologer. The astrologer co-collaborates with the client as both coach and astrologer to achieve goals based on the strengths and challenges seen in the astrology chart. The astrologer now has an on-going coaching relationship with the client rather than seeing the client once or twice a year. Additionally, the astrologer is in the position of being a more effective guide which not only leads to the success of the client this also fosters better client retention.

This course is divided into two 5-week classes. The purpose of the first five weeks is to provide instructions on the fundamentals of Life Coaching for astrologers which includes:

The four elements of coaching

- how to use the chart to recognize talents and the potential for success along with what is potentially holding the client back concerning achieving their goals
- 2. determining your niche
- 3. how to combine coaching with astrology
- 4. how to support the client

how to ask the right questions

setting up the coaching session, practice coaching sessions with peers

how to be a co-collaborator with the client.

Grading will be done via written quizzes, reading assignments, class participation and practice coaching sessions.

PD302 Fundamentals of Life Coaching for Astrologers: The Business of the Business

Instructor: Marie O'Neill

No Prerequisites

This course can be applied to the Professional Development Certificate and an elective for the Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

Life Coaching and astrology are a perfect fit for a counseling astrologer. The astrologer cocollaborates with the client as both coach and astrologer to achieve goals based on the strengths and challenges seen in the astrology chart. The astrologer now has an on-going coaching relationship with the client rather than seeing the client once or twice a year. Additionally, the astrologer is in the position of being a more effective guide which not only leads to the success of the client this also fosters better client retention.

This course is divided into two 5-week classes.

In this 5-week course we apply the fundamentals of coaching for astrologers from Part 1 to continue learning the skills necessary to be an effective coach along with learning how to set up a coaching practice and how to plan for success.

The focus of this course includes: continuing to develop the skill of using the astrology chart in a co-collaborative process with the client to help them determine the most effective strategy to achieve goals, how to foster accountability, ways to leverage coaching skills: group coaching vs. one on one coaching, workshops, memberships, etc.; how to set up an ethical

coaching practice, fee structure, marketing, practice coaching sessions with peers, how to develop credibility, and how to attract clients for your niche.

Grading will be done via written quizzes, reading assignments, class participation and practice coaching sessions.

PD303 Writing for Publications

Instructor: Alexandra Karacostas and Arlan Wise

No Prerequisites

This course can be applied to the Professional Development Certificate and an elective for the Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

Weekly topics:

- We discuss our goals for the next five weeks. Writing exercises teach you to be original
 and specific. Arlan and Alexandra share readings from some of the craft's masters. We
 then practice writing using these concepts. Homework needs to be ready before our
 next meeting.
- 2. Rick Levine co-teaches this class.
- 3. Today, we will examine the charts of some well-known writers and class members, keeping Mercury and the third house in mind. We will also review and edit more articles from those who wish to share their work and offer constructive insights and comments.
- 4. Julian Wise will co-teach this class. Julian is the style editor of OPA's book The Professional Astrologer and the owner of an independent publishing company. Julian will speak about editing, writing, and how to prepare a manuscript for publication. He will join Arlan and Alexandra to edit some of your written homework pieces.
- 5. In this final class we discuss your ideas for new writing endeavors, review earlier writing so you can see your accomplishments over the last five weeks. You may read to the group anything you have written over our time together. We will help you to set goals and create a timeline for your writing projects.

Electives are specific areas of study that allow people to expand their depth of knowledge. These classes are presented in a variety of methods and often combine interactive and self-paced learning. They are usually combined with other areas of study to combine into a certificate.

RA201 Dignities and Debilities

Instructor: Mychal Bryan

This course is an elective for the Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA) and a required course for Kepler Advanced Professional Diploma in Astrology (KAPDA)

Prerequisites: Basic astrological knowledge is necessary for students to get the most out of this class. Students need to be able to easily spot aspects with their eyes: not with aspect lines or an aspectarian.

At the end of this course, students will have a solid grasp of the role essential dignity and debility play in traditional astrology. They will have all the tools necessary to begin applying this knowledge to their practice and making concrete, event-based assessments regarding how a person's natal planets will manifest in their lives.

Weekly topics covered include:

- Laying the Foundations for Mastery In this module, you will learn why essential dignity and debility are such a critical part of traditional astrology interpretation. You will learn the five essential dignity levels and the three essential debility levels. At the end of this module, you will have all the tools necessary to understand and interpret the five levels of essential dignity.
- A World of Debility Sometimes, bad things happen in life. Traditional astrology has always been able to describe when, how, and why. In this module, you'll learn how to describe what possible outcomes an essentially debilitated planet can deliver. You'll learn how to narrow down those possibilities from a sea of a thousand potential predictions to the one or two that make the most sense based on the overall ecosystem of the chart.
- Mychal's Astrological Mnemotechnics (Memory Techniques) In this module, you will learn ancient memory techniques that will allow you to memorize the Triplicity Rulers in traditional astrology. You will become proficient at identifying which triplicity rulers are active based on the chart's sect and how to use them to discuss the 36 topics of the 12 houses. You will learn how the ancients used triplicity rulers to assess the best and worst financial periods within a person's life. You will also learn how to assess which periods of life will bring the greatest success and abundance. At the end of this module, you will have all the tools you need to use triplicity rulership within your astrological practice concretely.

- 1. **Mastering the Terms/Bounds** Finally, unlock the secret as to whose terms you should be using: the terms of Ptolemy or the terms of the Egyptians. You will learn traditional approaches to psychological astrology using the terms/bounds. You'll learn when to use them and when not to use them, so that you can streamline your astrological sessions.
- 2. **36 Faces of the Zodiac** In this week, you will explore the 36 decans or faces of traditional astrology. You will learn how to assess planets with strength only by face rulership. Finally, we will explore how the faces are expressed through the 36 numbered cards of the Qabalistic Tarot.
- 3. **Required Texts:** Mastering Traditional Astrology: A Depth of Beginning in the Celestial Art by Mychal A. Bryan

E102 Mesoamerican Astrology (independent study)

Instructor: Bruce Scofield, PhD (take any time, 4 months for completion)

This course is an elective for the Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

In Mesoamerican astrology, multiple units of time become signs. Learn how to work with this fascinating and unique tradition!

There are four major, world-class astrological traditions: Western astrology, which grew out of the Near East, Mediterranean, and Arab cultures; Indian astrology (Jyotish), which was strongly influenced by Greek astrology around 300 B.C.; Chinese astrology, ancient Indigenous astrology utilizing interlocking cycles of 12 and 10; and Mesoamerican astrology, whose origins go back to at least 500 B.C.

No significant outside influences altered Mesoamerican astrology's development until the Spanish's arrival five hundred years ago. At that time the Maya were in a state of decline and the Aztecs were at the peak of their empire. The effects of the Spanish invasion on the indigenous astrology was devastating. Friars were brought in to systematically eliminate as many of the traditional ways as possible to be replaced by the Christian model. Disease decimated the populations eliminating nearly all knowledgeable of the astrological traditions. Worst of all, most of the books were burned. Only a few relics, books, inscriptions and an oral tradition kept what is truly Native American astrology alive.

This course will allow students to become acquainted with the nature of Mesoamerican astrology and its foundations in the cosmology and mythology of the several cultures that flourished in ancient Mexico and northern Central America. In Mesoamerican astrology, time serves as a sign. The basic unit of one day, one rotation of the earth, is the foundation on which other units rest. The core of time-based Mesoamerican astrology is the 260-day astrological calendar. This time unit has links to astronomical cycles and was used for character description and choosing times for business trips and political or religious rituals. This 260-day calendar operates on several levels, one being the Long Count, which structures a 5,125-year era – best known as the Mayan Calendar, which "ended" in 2012.

Topics include:

- An overview of the region in which the Maya, Aztec and other Mesoamerican cultures were born followed by a first look at the astronomical underpinnings of the Mesoamerican calendars that are the basis of the indigenous astrology.
- An overview of the Popol Vuh, the Maya creation myth, and a discussion of the mysterious god Quetzalcoatl and the Four Suns legend of the Aztecs.
- The traditional meanings, god rulers, and modern interpretations of the day-signs that are at the core of Mesoamerican astrology.
- An analysis of the planet Venus, which so important in this tradition's astrology and how the ancient Mesoamericans regarded the Moon and planets.
- Creating a horoscope based on the symbols studied in this course will consider future possibilities of Mesoamerican astrology.

E201 Vocational Astrology

Instructor: Enid Newberg

This course is an elective for the Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

The best job matches who we are with how we earn a living. When there is a mismatch, we experience anxiety, frustration, and burnout. After two years of pandemic-induced stress and change in the workplace, millions of people are re-evaluating what they want to do with themselves to earn money. As astrologers, we have tools that can assist our clients to assess how their interests, abilities, values, and personalities impact their daily work.

Weekly Topics:

- Introduction to vocational counseling and creative visualization. This week explores the
 basics of career counselling from a cultural and astrological perspective. Students will
 combine creative visualizations with astrological symbols to gain insight into an
 individual's personality (for example, graphic depictions of "I like/I dislike" and "I
 want/I don't want")
- 2. Personal happiness and social usefulness Part 1. The Personal Planets and the Angles: their expression, needs, challenges, and interactions.
- 3. Personal happiness and social usefulness Part 2. The Astrological Houses: Traditionally, astrologers have used the 2nd, 6th, and 10th houses along with the Midheaven as indicators of career. But the other houses also have their roles.
- 4. Putting it together. Students will explore the effectiveness of different astrological methods to interpret career potential.

Required reading: All required material will be provided by the instructor.

E202 Harmonics

Instructor: Rick Levine

This course is an elective for the Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)

Prerequisites:

Solid fundamental knowledge of astrological basics—planets, signs, houses, Ptolemaic aspects.

This course revisits the theoretical basis and the evolution of aspects in astrology, presenting harmonic aspects in a practical and usable framework. Relying on astrological basics with concepts from sacred geometry, students will be taught to integrate aspects based upon non-zodiacal relationships, including quintiles, septiles, octiles, noviles and more. These harmonic aspects widen the astrological palette and enable the astrologer to quickly find previously hidden dimensions of personality.

Students will learn:

- How to integrate harmonic aspects into basic chart analysis.
- To present a solid rationale for using harmonic aspect.
- To demonstrate the efficacy of harmonic aspects.
- To bring harmonic aspects down to earth.
- To develop practice based upon established theory.

Weekly Topics:

- 1. Course overview. The historical perspective: evolution of aspect theory. Aspects as harmonics. The shift from discrete planetary points to vibratory hum. The difference between harmonic charts and harmonic aspects. Introduction to the fundamental harmonic aspects. The role of midpoints in harmonic resonance. Physical and metaphysical aspects. Aspects and gender bias. Revisioning orbs.
- 2. Review of zodiacal aspects, inconjuncts, and non-Ptolemaic aspects. Working with the 8th harmonic aspect series. Oppositions, squares, and octiles (semisquares and sesquisquares). Octile configurations. Oppositions with the Point of Thor and Point of Thales. Thor's Hammer. Chart examples.
- 3. Introducing the 5th and 7th harmonic aspects (quintiles & septiles). Quintiles, the Venus star, and the golden mean. Quintiles, deciles, and creativity. Septiles, fate, and metaphysical complexity. Quintile & septile configurations. Quintile yods and septile yods. Oppositions with the Point of Fibonacci and the Points of Fate. How quintiles and septiles quickly reveal hidden dimensions of a natal chart. Chart examples.
- 4. Introduction of the 9th and 11th harmonic aspects (noviles and elftiles). Noviles and superconductivity. Novile configurations that stimulate trines. Elftiles and the outsiders. Elftile configurations that stand alone. Chart examples.

5. Putting it all together. Bringing harmonic aspects into natal chart consultations. Evaluating harmonic resonance. Symmetry and complex patterns. Topics for further exploration. Chart examples.

Kepler Advanced Professional Diploma in Astrology (KAPDA)

The Kepler Advanced Professional Diploma in Astrology (KAPDA) through Kepler College allows students to further develop their knowledge of Astrology by completing an additional 60 weeks of study plus a demonstration of professional growth.

Kepler Advanced Professional Diploma in Astrology (KAPDA) will progress your skill level in three ways:

Equivalent Non-Kepler Courses

Evidence of NCGR Level II completion or greater, OCA graduation, and AFA professional-level certification equivalencies will be dealt with individually.

Credit can be given for Chris Brennan's Hellenistic Astrology and Chart Calculation course through IAA or NCGR Level II. An interview may be part of the evaluation process.

There is a \$50 cost for each evaluation. The student is responsible for submitting the evaluation paperwork to request a challenge.

Tuition & Fees

Tuition

- To enroll, you only need to sign up and pay for the course you are
 interested in. Students do not have to decide ahead of time whether they
 will complete a Certificate or the Diploma. Kepler College tracks each
 student's progress and someone is always available to help if you want
 assistance in deciding your path.
- There is a one-time registration fee of \$40
- Please note that a five percent advance pricing discount is available for Certificate and Diploma courses if you enroll up to two weeks before the term starts.

Individual certificate course: 10 weeks = \$590.00; 5 weeks = \$295.00

- Individual certificates are either 30 or 40 weeks
 - o Cost for 30 weeks = \$1770.00
 - \circ Cost for 40 weeks = \$2,360.00
- Kepler Professional Diploma in Astrology (KPDA)
 - o 130 weeks of study plus a final demonstration of learning
 - \circ Cost = \$7,670.00
- Kepler Advanced Professional Diploma in Astrology (KAPDA)
 - o 60 additional weeks of study
 - o Cost \$3,540.00

Transfer of Credit fee: \$50 for each evaluation request

Challenge fee: \$100 for each test submitted

Non-credit workshops or focus seminars range from \$35 to \$395.

All are held online and can be a single-day workshop or multiple weeks in duration consisting of 120-minute Zoom conferences. They are recorded, and the student will have access to the data for three years.

Other Expenses

- Books: Students should expect to pay approximately \$25-\$60 for books for each course.
- Astrological Software: Most courses do not need astrological software. The instructors will indicate if the software is needed.
- Several different software companies offer discounts for Kepler College students. Discount codes can be found in the college's Library.

WORKSHOPS

Workshops are online and accessed via our online classrooms. Refunds can be requested up to 24 hours before the start date. A refund can be a Store Credit for the full amount, that can be used anytime in the Kepler College Store OR a full refund less a \$20 service charge.

COURSES

Refunds are available after the first class but before the second class begins. The refund can be taken as a Store Credit for the full amount or a refund less a \$20 administration fee.

Refund requests based on non-attendance or unawareness of refund procedures are NOT considered justifiable.

Cancellation of a Course

Occasionally a course a course that was scheduled to take place in a particular term might have to be rescheduled or canceled.

If Kepler College cancels the course, you will be offered the following options

Move to another course in the same term

- Store Credit for the full amount. The Store Credit can be used on anything in the store
- Full refund for the amount paid.

Online Education

Many students want to learn in an environment that maximizes flexibility, whether in terms of time or place. The Certificate Program's online structure gives students the flexibility to schedule when and where they pursue their studies.

This means we will offer not only a wide range of knowledge about astrological techniques but also the skills to become effective practitioners, including business and technology skills and an understanding of human behaviour to enable the astrologer to be sensitive to client needs and ethical considerations.

Course Design

Students fulfill their course requirements through reading, various types of assignments, writing, researching, and participating in online discussion forums and live interactions via the Internet. Central to the learning experience is collaborative learning relationships with faculty and fellow students. Most courses will have written materials as well as audio or audio-visual lectures available online.

Students and faculty will communicate regularly via a secure internet course site, e-mail, and web conferencing.

Learning objectives, topic overviews, assignments, and other information for each course are posted online. Presentations, papers, or other demonstrations of learning may be required to cover selected areas of study. Research projects may also be required.

Learning Style Considerations

Online learning requires some self-discipline to be successful. If you answer yes to the following questions, online learning may be right for you.

- Can you stay on task without direct supervision?
- Can you manage your time well and prioritize your workload?

- Are you able to learn by reading?
- Do you usually understand written instructions?

Technical Considerations

- **Browser requirements**: Google Chrome; and Mozilla Firefox v34 are the most stable. We have found that our online classroom and websites experience problems on Safari and Edge .
- Audio: Sound card and headphones or speakers. Headphones work best because they keep out background noise and help create a better recording for your class sessions.
- Mobile systems:
 - o iOS 9 or later
 - o iPhone 4s or later; iPad 2 or later
 - WiFi connection -3G or better
- We use the Zoom software for our live classroom sessions.
 - o TO TEST YOUR SYSTEM for our live meeting software:
 - Go to your online classroom, and test the Zoom link. Each classroom has a unique meeting link.
 - If you have problems connecting, contact the registrar at registrar@keplercollege.org
 - You can connect via your phone or iPad as well.
- For Moodle the online classroom software
 - O Internet connection: minimum 56 Kbps for self-paced courses (caution: if video is present, it will be poor at this speed)
 - o Screen resolution: minimum 800 x 600; preferably at least 1024 x 768
 - Mobile Apps. You can use a web browser or a mobile app to access your course site. If you are interested in the app, you can see the entire list of features here: https://docs.moodle.org/34/en/Moodle_Mobile_features
- Software for assignments
 - O A word processor that can read and write .RTF files and read and write .DOC files
 - Presentation software such as PowerPoint, Google Docs presentation, OpenOffice or LibreOffice Impress.
 - o A presentation program that can read or write to the MS Powerpoint .ppt format

- o Optional: A spreadsheet program that can read or write to the MS Excel .xls format
- The ability to view video files in an .MP4 format and listen to files in an .MP3 format.
- Astrological software is not required for most courses as most students can use online resources like Astro.com to prepare a chart.
 - Kepler College is a vendor for the astrological software companies Astrolable (SolarFire), Time Passages (MAC & PC), Astro Gold, Nova Charts, and Cosmic Patterns (Pegasus, Kepler and Sirius).
 - Students can also use Solar Fire or similar products for desktops and laptops or various apps for tablets and phones.

Software

Free Software Alternatives

We ask the students to create their assignments on their computer and copy and paste into the online classroom.

You can choose any software that you are comfortable with to create your work. Below are some suggestions for free software that is available to you.

Office Software

If you do not have Microsoft Office software for word processing, spreadsheets and presentations:

- **LibreOffice**: This excellent open source software is similar to Microsoft Office and includes Writer (equivalent to Word), Calc (equivalent to Excel) and Impress (equivalent to PowerPoint). It will read and write MS Office documents and understands .doc, .rtf, .xls and .ppt file formats. For more information, visit http://www.libreoffice.org/
- Google Docs: If you have email using gmail, you have access to Google Docs, which has free online office software (including equivalents to Word, Excel and PowerPoint)
- Microsoft Office Online (free edition). This is a limited version of the Microsoft Office Suite and provides good basic functionality.

Astrological Software

You are not required to purchase astrological software for most courses. Free astrological software sufficient for most course assignments is available on several websites, including:

Exceptions

- Software similar to Jigsaw, Solar Fire or Sirius will make your studies considerably easier in RP301 Rectification.
- You will need Nova Chart Wheels in Symmetrical Astrology Part 2 and 3 (you will receive a 1/2 price discount on Nova Chart Wheels when you enroll in the course).

E-mail: You must have an active e-mail account and be familiar with sending and receiving e-mail.

IMPORTANT: The Registrar must have your current e-mail address when you register AND whenever you change to a new e-mail address.

Computer experience

Before you begin your courses, you will need the following skills and capabilities. Limited assistance is available if you have problems in any of these areas.

- Know how to open, create, save, print, and move files on or from your computer.
- Know how to download files and find them later.
- Know how to play video files.
- Know how to install software on your computer.
- Be able to access the internet and search different locations on a regular basis.
- Know how to download and print documents from the Internet.
- Know how to upload documents to the Internet.
- Have an active e-mail address and know how to send and receive e-mail messages.
- Know how to attach a file to an e-mail and open a file attachment.
- Know how to "copy and paste" text to and from office applications, the Internet and e-mail

Policies

Requirements for Completion

To earn a certificate, the student must complete the prescribed curriculum, earn a passing grade, and satisfactorily discharge all financial obligations for their program.

Use of Personal Charts

Although questions about a student's chart may be part of some class assignments, in general, delineating a student's natal chart with all its birth data will not be the focus of classroom exercises. There are several reasons for this:

- Personal charts have personal data (birth date and time), which can compromise an individual's privacy;
- Not all students are comfortable with sharing chart information, and we want to ensure no student feels pressure to share information they prefer to keep private;
- Sharing personal charts can impact students' ability to learn because the focus often shifts to one's chart rather than to the learning objective.

Students can ask questions in class related to their charts. Of course, students can and do share their charts with their fellow students and friends at any time outside the classroom.

Astrological Consultations by Faculty

Faculty cannot ethically accept an individual student as a client to provide a chart reading or other astrological work. When the student is no longer enrolled at Kepler, this conflict of interest does not apply.

Confidentiality of Records

Information about student views, beliefs, private activities, and political associations, which is acquired or learned by Kepler Certificate Program administration, faculty or employees during work, is treated with professional judgment and confidentially. Professional evaluations and references about the ability and character of students may be provided under appropriate circumstances (for example, a student requests an evaluation to present to another party).

Retention of Records

All documentation submitted in support of a certificate or course challenge becomes the property of Kepler and may not be returned or reproduced.

Evaluations

The Kepler College Certificate Program uses multiple methods to assess whether a student has passed a course, including performance observation, projects, demonstrations of learning, discussion participation, test results, and more. This encourages faculty to design courses beyond memorizing information. Students learn how to apply what they have learned in practice situations.

Incomplete Work

Students are expected to complete the course work meeting the deadlines provided. The instructor can extend the deadline for the final assignment. If the coursework is not completed by the assigned date, the student will be moved to Audit status in the classroom. A credit for the course will not be awarded. The student will have access to the course material for three (3) years. The student can choose to retake the course if they would like to earn credit. There is no monetary discount for taking the course additional times.

Faculty's Evaluation of Your Work

The faculty's evaluation of your work will be based on the following criteria:

Participation and quality of responses in scheduled online discussions and study questions

Quality and improvement in written work and/or oral presentations.

To pass a certificate course, you must maintain an average of 70% or more on the required course activities (requirements will be determined by the instructor and posted to the course website).

Student Rights and Responsibilities

The Kepler College Certificate Program provides an environment that respects and encourages the freedom to learn and to teach. In celebrating teaching and learning, it is appropriate to view individuals and groups about their potential to contribute within the learning environment. Each has dignity and value.

As a community of people seeking education, Kepler College students are dedicated to improving personally and educationally. Students should:

- Practice personal and educational integrity.
- Maintain standards of performance.
- Contribute to a safe, cooperative, and respectful learning environment.
- Respect and promote diversity and dignity of all persons.
- Respect the rights and property of all persons.
- Bear the ultimate responsibility for the effects of their decisions and behavior.

Each student in a learning community has rights that accompany these responsibilities. These rights are to be protected by students, faculty and staff regardless of race, sex, religion, color, creed, disability, sexual orientation, political affiliation, national origin, ancestry, or age. Student rights include:

- The right to be informed about course requirements
- The right to be notified about policies and procedures.
- Prejudices or capricious evaluation shall not inhibit students' access to education.

Students may disagree with the information and reserve judgment about matters of opinion, but they are responsible for learning the course content.

Honesty in Learning

An honor code is necessary in any legitimate learning environment. All forms of dishonesty, including cheating, plagiarism, and work fabrication—such as using AI to create your answers—violate the honor code. Students who violate this code will be disciplined. Depending upon the severity of the violation, this can result in a warning and a requirement to redo work, up to and including immediate expulsion from the Certificate Program.

Cheating is defined as purposefully using or attempting to use unauthorized materials, information or study aids in any assignment. Plagiarism is defined as representing the works or ideas of another as one's own in any assignment. This includes but is not limited to directly copying texts and materials, failure to list sources of arguments and information, and failure to acknowledge collaboration in the authorship of written assignments.

Harassment

The Kepler College Certificate Program will not tolerate harassment, discrimination or sexual violence toward its students, faculty or staff. In all its forms, harassment, discrimination, and assault violate fundamental rights and the law.

Students who witness or experience sexual harassment or discrimination in their courses or at Kepler Colelge -sponsored events are asked to report the incident. Instructors, adjuncts, supervisors, and administration are charged with promoting and maintaining an atmosphere that properly deters and responds to harassment and discrimination.

Conflict Resolution

Most complaints can be resolved by talking directly with the person with whom you have a complaint. If talking does not resolve your complaint, discuss it with the individual's immediate supervisor or the Certificate Program administration. If you don't know who that is, ask.
